DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Talk about your morning routine—what are the 2-3 things you always do when you get up? Why are those things important?
2. Talk about a time of “darkness” in your life. What got you through that time? What did “dawn” look like?
3. Casey said that the Bible talks about “sin” as “missing the mark”—talk about how that is the same or different from your understanding of sin?
4. In the story of the young son, the son spends all of his inheritance and falls into the middle of a famine. In that moment, he decides to go home and beg for forgiveness. Talk about a time when you were far from home and you “came to your senses” (Luke 15:17). What was the hardest part of going home?
5. Easter is the celebration of the resurrection, but more than that Easter is the encouragement for us to go forward and “live” like the resurrection happened. Talk as a group about one thing you may do this year with the freedom that comes with knowing that death has been defeated.
